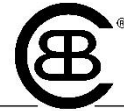

Accreditation Criteria to register a company



CERTIFIED BLACK BUSINESS GROUP

Validation

About Certification The purpose of certification is to assure Certified Black Business corporate members that the Black business they seek to contract with is majority-owned as well as managed and controlled by people of Black origin.

The definition of a Black business is characterised for the benefit of certification and to establish the business as a bona fide. A CBB business can be considered as any of the following, LTD, PLC, LLP, CIC, Charity, not for profit or Social enterprise, regardless of size, turnover, located in the UK, Europe, USA, Canada, Asia, which is 75% or more owned, managed and controlled by a "Black-owned". for classification and transparency this application shall mean individuals, organisation, business, or institutions whose ethnic origin is:

Black/African/Caribbean/Black British

- African
- Caribbean
- Other Black

Mixed/Multiple Ethnic Group

- White and the Black Caribbean
- White and Black African
- Black and Asian
- Black and Other

The individuals are required to the UK, Europe, USA, Canada, Asia Nationals and/or who permanently reside within each of the respective countries or have indefinite leave to remain status within whichever country they reside "Ownership or Owned" by Black individuals means the business is at least 75% owned by such individuals or, in the event of a publicly owned organisation, at least 51% of the stock is retained by one or more such individuals. Further, that Black individuals control the management and daily business operations.

By progressing to the next step of applying for CBB accreditation for your business you confirm that you have read, understand and abide by our application criteria process and the governing shareholder and director with rights to make this application for and on behalf of your business.
